Life is filled with joyous occasions and beauty unquestionably amazing. Yet, we have daily challenges, disappointments, questions, and perhaps anger or outrage. The state of New York recently passed the most unrestrictive abortion on demand law in the

United States and the governor celebrated by ordering the top of One World Trade Center to be *lit up* pink. One's initial reaction could very well be outrage, incredulity. We are reminded, however, "Fear not, I am with you...I will strengthen you and help you, and uphold you." This is an opportunity for each of us to have a conversation with others about the humanity of the unborn and the sanctity of all human life.

Despite scientific and technological advances to support the truth of human life, those who support taking the lives of vulnerable, innocent pre-born babies are "shouting their abortions", no longer hiding behind the lies promulgated in early years after Roe v. Wade. Each of you keep abreast of the latest news; but for many who are not aware of the legislation and political leanings of our elected officials, we are presented with an opportunity to have a conversation with truth, honesty, and compassion.

As we begin 2019, there will be many opportunities to be a public witness for life. Whether you participate in a pro-life march, a prayer vigil, a protest at an abortion mill, or you advocate for the pre-born with a conversation you have with a colleague or friend, you will be supporting others who sometimes might feel alone or incapable of speaking out on behalf of the vulnerable.

Each of us can be positive change to promote the culture of life. Here are 5 suggestions to do so in 2019:

- 1. Say a prayer each day to end abortion.
- 2. Be a positive role model in your home, your classroom, and your community.
- 3. Share a lesson plan with your colleagues that incorporates a pro-life/respect life theme. (Send *Teachers Saving Children* a copy as well, please.)
- 4. Participate in a local pro-life outreach event in your local area.
- 5. Read a good book on abortion this year. *Abolishing Abortion* by Frank Pavone is one of many good books you might consider.

Remember, "Speak the truth with love" and "Changing a person's heart will help change his/her mind" are effective principles to implement when seeking to engage others in positive dialogue and positive change.

PRO-LIFE BOOK REVIEW

How The Republican Party Became Pro-Life by Phyllis Schlafly (© 2016 Dunrobin Publishing)

Phyllis Schlafly (1924-2016) was a national leader of the conservative movement. She was best known as the founder of the national volunteer organization, Eagle Forum. She first drew recognition in 1964 on the self-publication of her best-selling book, *A Choice Not An Echo*, which was an expose of how the Republican Party's choice of its presidential nominees was manipulated by a group of international powerbrokers from 1936-1964. (This book was revised and expanded to include 1968-2016 and re-released in 2014.) Students of political history, and anyone interested in politics, would likely find *A Choice Not An Echo* intriguing and somewhat distressing.

How The Republican Party Became Pro-Life digs deeper into how, since 1976, the Republican presidential platform has expressed respect for human life, and specifically for the pre-born. The book chronicles the weakening of anti-abortion laws in the 1960's, and Nixon's signing in 1970 of Title X legislation, the Family Planning Services and Population Research Act. Following Roe v. Wade in 1973, Schlafly and other Republicans worked to ensure that pro-life, pro-family language was included in the party's national platform. Phyllis Schlafly's own role in this process is discussed but not stressed.

In light of our current President's stance in opposition to abortion, it is intriguing to read how the Party's pro-life position has been gradually strengthened since 1976. The book is a quick read and written in laymen's language. It includes four appendices that would be of interest to pro-life, pro-family educators, and especially helpful to those teaching U.S. History or Social Studies. The book could prove to be a useful resource to students researching the current political climate in our nation. It is available through Eagle Forum or on Amazon.

ORANGE SOCKS: Inspiring Life Despite a Diagnosis

"There are others out there who know exactly how you feel." That's the message inherent to an organization that seeks to serve as "a parent network helping families find a new normal through a prenatal + infant + child diagnosis." Orange Socks wants

to help parents "learn from people who have walked the path before them." To do so, parents may read and/or post "Stories of Hope" that profile families that include a child with developmental disabilities. Parents may also "select a diagnosis" to gather information; also, links are available to "Local and National Resources." Orange Socks is "an initiative by RISE Services, Inc., a nonprofit company that supports individuals with developmental disabilities." The Story of Abby Johnson's conversion from Planned Parenthood's youngest Clinic Director to an outspoken pro-life advocate has been made into a movie. Entitled *Unplanned*, the movie will be released into theaters nationwide on March 29, 2019. The movie was shown on January 17th, 2019 at the 2019 Pro-Life Expo that was held in conjunction with the March For Life in Washington, D.C. Sean Carney of *40 Days For Life* calls it "the most pro-life movie ever made." He stated in a recent newsletter, "*Unplanned* will be the definitive movie on abortion, and it shows the reality of Planned Parenthood and what every abortion does to an unborn child." The trailer for the movie is available for viewing on YouTube.

Abby's story is also available in her 2011 autobiography, *Unplanned: The Dramatic True Story of a Former Planned Parenthood Leader's Eye-Opening Journey Across the Life Line.* Abby released a new book, *The Walls Are Talking: Former Abortion Workers Tell Their Stories*, in 2018. Abby is the founder of *And Then There Were None*, a ministry that aids workers to leave the abortion industry and find other work.
